Winemaker Notes

It is comprised of the best vineyards, grown in the best soil, from the best appellations. Perfectly structured, Loam balances the bright focused tannins of hillside fruit with the dense, rich characteristics of fruit grown in the ancient river bed and valley floor soils. The 2008 vintage showcases the elegance of the cooler vintage; while at the same time embodying Cabernets unparalleled complexity and structure. With developed tannins and perfectly balanced acidity, this Cabernet will age beautifully for the next 7-10 years.
